National First Responders Day on October 28 recognizes the heroic men and women who make it their business to take immediate action when disaster strikes. Congress designated October 28th as National First Responders Day in 2017. The resolution honors the firefighters, police officers, paramedics/EMTs, medical personnel and all those who are first on the scene in stressful situations. For all church members who are part of the First Responders team, we thank you. When you see a police officer, fireman, EMT, etc., please recognize them and thank them for their service.

#### VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION



**Veterans Day** (originally known as Armistice Day) is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11, for honoring military veterans of the United States Armed Forces. It coincides with other holidays including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day which are celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. However, in 1954, the holiday was changed to "Veterans Day" to account for all veterans in all wars.

**Coffee and Biscuits at Bonaventure Retirement Center:** This year we are planning a special Veterans Day recognition at the Bonaventure of Castle Rock retirement facility. We had a successful Coffee and Biscuits back on August 16<sup>th</sup> with over a dozen veterans and spouses along with several volunteers from the church.

The USSM ministry is planning a Veterans Day recognition at Bonaventure scheduled for November 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a special gathering for the veterans and spouses including a recognition celebration of the residents at Bonaventure. The gathering with the veterans and spouses will be at 2:00 pm with the other residents at Bonaventure invited to join at 2:30 to thank the veterans for their services. The Wellspring Community will be baking some special cookies for the event.

**Veterans Day** observance at Castle Oaks will be on Sunday **November 13th**. Veterans Day is a time for us to say thanks to those who have served in the Armed Forces. Castle Oaks Church will have a special recognition of the men and women who have served in the armed forces. The USSM ministry will also host a **Meet-and-Thanks** after the service. All veterans, active military, along with their families are welcome to join with the social gathering in the lobby of the church.

## VETERAN SERVICES FOCUS

Something new in this newsletter is a focus on veteran service organizations. As we approach Veterans Day next month, it is important for us to look at organizations that reach out to our veterans and provide necessary services in their support.

One special organization is the Remount Foundation down in Colorado Springs. This organization operates on a thousand acres within the Air Force Academy's Academy Equestrian Center.

The resupply of horses to military fronts of American armed forces dates back to the Civil War, but it had been an ad hoc affair. In 1908, the U.S. Army began the Remount Service, a formal program providing horses for moving armies, artillery, and supplies. For U.S. Troops, Remount horses also warmed hearts and raised morale during wartime.





Today, the Remount Service legacy lives on. The Remount Foundation provides active-duty military, veterans, first responders and their families with free equine-assisted therapeutic activities within a healing, natural environment, and a supportive community to empower them to heal physically, mentally and spiritually. The Remount Foundation has helped heal trauma in upwards of 4,500 warriors from all services, active duty and veterans, officers and enlisted, men and women in addition to their families. It has expanded to also help first responders, as well as children dealing with conditions such as trauma, behavioral disorders and autism.

The foundation has been in existence for over 25 years. With Colorado Springs home to five U.S. Army and Air Force military installations, word spread, especially through the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the U.S. Army's Warrior Transition Battalion for wounded warriors at nearby Fort Carson. With horses at the focus, the Remount Foundation now offers individual and group sessions in a variety of therapy techniques. Remount Foundation cofounder Billy Jack Barrett says, "For decades Remount horses transported warriors into battle, now the animals are carrying their riders down the road to healing."
